90th Commencement; Fr. Wm. Sullivan '48 Outstanding Alumnus

The 90th commencement was held the weekend of May 22 — 24 at Campion. On Friday evening the Alumni Association held its annual senior dinner. Alumni from around the midwest attended along with the graduating seniors, faculty, and administrators. This dinner was an opportunity to welcome the seniors into the Alumni Association.

Baccalaureate and Mass were held in the chapel at 8:15 p.m. Saturday evening. The sermon was presented by the Very Reverend J. R. Hilbert, S.J., President of Campion. A reception for the graduates and their guests followed.

On Sunday at 9:00 a.m., 118 seniors received their diplomas. The presentation of various awards and scholarships was made by Reverend G. F. Lucey, S.J., Principal. Very Reverend J. R. Hilbert, S.J., then presented the Duhamel award to the outstanding senior who was Mark G. Wood; the Edmund Campion award to the outstanding member of the faculty, Mr. Andrew J. Thon, S.J., and the Edmund Campion award to the most outstanding alumnus — Reverend William J. Sullivan, S.J. '48. Father Sullivan followed with his commencement address.

To Receive Edmund Campion Award

Reverend William J. Sullivan, S.J. '48, was named the first recipient of the Edmund Campion Award which was presented Sunday, May 24, at the 90th commencement exercises. Father Sullivan is the acting chairman of the Theology department at Marquette University and is a member of the Campion Board of Regents.

The Edmund Campion Award is being given for the first time to honor one of Campion's outstanding alumni. The selection was made by a committee composed of alumni, faculty, and administrators. Father Sullivan was one of six alumni nominated for this year. The reward is based on loyalty and dedication, service to the church, and exemplifying the Christian ideals and principles of Campion.

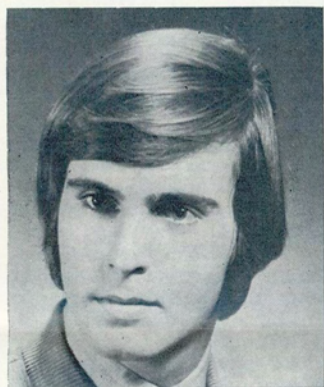
Father Sullivan is the son of Mrs. Arlie Sullivan of Prairie du Chien, Wis. Born on Dec. 20, 1930 in Freeport, Ill., Father Sullivan was reared in Prairie du Chien and attended Campion from 1944 to 1948. After graduation he entered the Society of Jesus. He received B.A. and M.A. degrees from St. Louis University with a major in Philosophy. From 1955 to 1958 he taught the classics at Creighton Prep.

In 1958 Father Sullivan went to France where he did his basic theological training at the Jesuit faculty of Lyons-Fourviere under Henri De Lubac, Jacques Guillet, Henri Bouillard, and others. After four years in France, he spent two years in Germany, the first year at Munster and the second at Heidelberg. At Heidelberg he studied Lutheran theology under Peter Brunner and Heinrich Bornkamm.

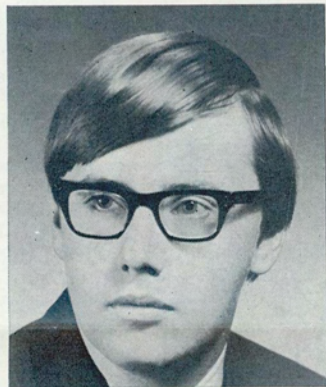
Father Sullivan returned to the United States in 1964 and entered the Religious Studies program at Yale. His major interest was contemporary Protestant systematics and his special work was in Karl Barth. While at Yale he served as an Assistant in Instruction at the Yale Divinity School under Julian Hartt and as chaplain to the Catholic students at Choate School.

In 1967 Father Sullivan joined the Department of Theology at Marquette University as an Assistant Professor of Theology. He is teaching contemporary Protestant theology and systematic theology with special interest in the theology of man. In May of 1969, Father Sullivan became Acting Chairman of the Department of Theology and Chairman of the Executive Committee of the Department. He is a member of the University Committee on Spiritual Welfare and of the special Presidential Committee on Culturally Distinct Students. He is also a member of the Board of Advisors of Theological Studies.

Valentines Day was an appropriate time for Assemblyman **Leo J. Ryan '43**, the man with the heart, to step foot outside the gates of Folsom Prison — a free man for the first time in a week. Carrying more than 70 pages of notes he scribbled down about seven days of life behind bars in California's top maximum security prison. The purpose of the former school teacher's unusual experiment was to educate himself about the hopelessness and bitterness of the convict's life. Folsom Prison is a graduate school for the most dangerous men in the state of California. "I believe direct experience is vital to learning and understanding," the San Mateo county Democratic told an interviewer in his 9 x 12 foot cell, where the lights go on at 6:00 a.m. and go off at 10:00 p.m. "One of the answers to bringing about prison reform is for public officials and authorities to see how it works." It ought to be required for everyone from district attorneys to judges to have this kind of direct learning experience," he said. "There are major arguments for alternatives to the existing system; moral, economic, humanistic and most importantly, the fact that it fails," he told an interviewer. Fr. Sullivan has lectured widely both in France, where he spoke frequently under the auspices of the USIA, and in this country. During the past years he has lectured at Yale, Georgetown, University of Houston, Manhattanville and other schools. He has also spoken frequently to clergy, parish and ecumenical groups. He was a featured speaker at the 1969 John XXIII Forum in Mississippi and opened a similar clergy series in Alabama. Father Sullivan has published approximately thirty articles on religious and theological topics in such journals as *Stimmen der Zeit*, *Orientierung*, *America*, *The Catholic World*, and *Religious Education*. He has finished the manuscript of a book on "Faith" and is working on a book on "The Theology of Man".

Cindermen Establish New School Records

Considering Campion has no track, the 1970 track squad has done a fine job capturing 4th place in the CWCC meet. Throughout the season the Knights competing mainly in relays have placed about 5th in 12 to 20 team meets.

Outstanding for Campion are junior, Kim Keuter, who set new school records in the two-mile run (9:50) and the mile run (4:33). Junior, Greg McMoore, the team workhorse, ran in the relays, 440 yard dash, low hurdles, and the long jump. He hopes to set a new record in the 440; the best time so far is 50.5 seconds.

Mark Valley and Dick Noggle, both seniors, competed in the field events. Valley is consistently around 12 feet in the pole vault and 6 feet in the high jump. Noggle throws the shot put about 48 feet and set a new record in the discuss with 158 feet. Junior, Doug Lipke, competed in all the sprints and jumping events. Mark Otteson, a sophomore, is a fine miler. Others contributing points are Jeff Janowski, in the hurdles and sprints and Joe Hutter in the hurdles.

At the conference meet, Keuter won the two-mile, Lipke won the 100 yard dash, Noggle won the discuss, and McMoore and Valley took second places in the 440 and pole vault. Otteson captured third place in the mile, and Noggle third place in the shot put.

The Camp will have four sessions running from June 28 — July 4; July 5 — July 11; July 19 — July 25; and July 26 — August 1.

Tennis Squad Captures State Championship

Campion captured the 1970 WISAA Tennis Championship with a total of 25 team points. This was the first State Tennis Crown for the Knights, who finished third at State last year.

John Stanhaus and Chris Braun, a junior and sophomore, swept to the doubles title; while in No. 1 Singles, John Schrup lost to top-seeded Mike Cahill 6-4, 6-2 to finish second. Don Hudson, runner-up last year, won third place in the No. 2 Singles. The Knights expect a return trip to Oshkosh next year to vigorously defend their title.

Campion's tennis squad, coached by Father Jack McNellis, S.J., captured the CWCC tennis title for the third year in a row. John Schrup, a junior, and Don Hudson, a senior, met for the singles championship with Schrup the winner. Meanwhile, juniors John Stanhaus and Chris Braun went on to capture the doubles title in a Campion dominated conference meet. Schrup, Campion's number one man, has not lost a match this year as he prepares for the State Championships.

Golfers Finish 4th

This spring has been up and down for Campion's golf team on the way to .500 season. Coaching the squad is Father Frank Burke, S.J., who sees great things for this young squad. There were only three seniors on the team, Captain Keith Leighty, Paul Vadovicky and Bob Means.

The toughest competition came from Dubuque Wahlert, LaCrosse Aquinas and La Crosse Central, all favored to win the championship in their state associations. The top seven men this season are Pete Percival, Charlie Gore, Jack Downey, Joe Orrico, Bob Means, Vadovicky and Leighty. Others seeing action were John Bowen, Jack Perlmutter, and Bill Leighty.

As a team the Knights averaged about 80-82 which is good enough to win most meets. However, against Wahlert, Central, and Aquinas the team would have to shoot par golf to win.

At the conference meet Campion placed 4th and moves on to the state championship.

Prof. Basil Rauch '25 Returns To Campion

Prof. Basil Rauch '25, chairman of the department of history at Barnard College of Columbia University, New York was a guest of the Campion Community for four days following a Chicago convention of American professors at which he represented Columbia University.

Prof. Rauch attended Notre Dame University and later the Yale University Graduate School.

During his four day visit at Campion he was particularly impressed with the overall picture of Campion today as a college preparatory school. While here he visited classes of the Classical Studies Department and discussed various educational problems with the Campion faculty. He also attended the Black Studies Class conducted each Thursday at Campion.

In a statement summing up the overall educational environment at Campion the distinguished professor stated, "I am deeply impressed by the lively intellectual atmosphere at Campion today. The books the boys read are far higher in quality than anything we used to read. To find a student who does impressive paintings like those I see today (in, for example, Lucey Hall rooms) would have been impossible in my time. Above all, in the classroom, it is clear that instructors are working for meanings where a generation ago they imposed pure memory work. Floreat Campion!"
